Jasmine Connor A* for sociology, A for psychology and a C for maths. Studying Psychology at Nottingham University.



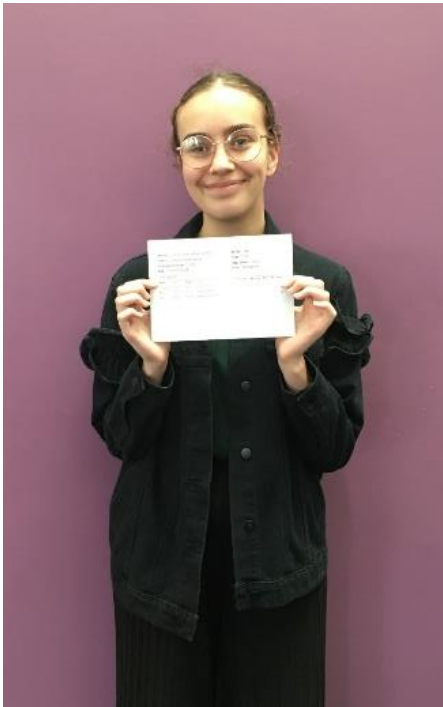
