

## Year 11 Citizenship PPE 1 – November 2021

You will sit a shortened Paper 1 (Active Citizenship and Politics and Participation) on **Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November** and then a full Paper 2 (Life in Modern Britain and Rights and Responsibilities) on **Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November**.

We haven't completed your investigation yet so cannot do the full Paper 1.

### Paper 1 - Active Citizenship and Politics and Participation (1hr 15 mins)

- Investigating the Actions of others (Pressure groups, holding people to account, Lobbying, charities etc)
- How do people bring about change in society – methods and reasons.
- Roles of Councillors, Politicians in political parties and in government, Different ways countries govern themselves and relevant major positions (ie Prime Minister), Civil Servants, UK Cabinet
- Referendums – why, how etc
- Different types of Parliament (UK, US, EU etc)
- Electoral systems including why people should vote
- Rights of UK Citizens compared with other countries

### Paper 2 - Life in Modern Britain and Rights and Responsibilities (1hr 45mins)

- Free Press (Regulators, types of press, freedom of Media.
- Identity – what it is, proportion of population etc
- International Organisations – UN, WTO, Commonwealth, EU etc
- Democratic process and relevance to politics, types of democracy.
- Methods used by pressure groups
- Different types of Courts – what do they do?
- Types of resolution.
- Differing legal systems (UK, EU, US etc)
- Trade Unions – what are they, how do they work, why would government try to restrict them?
- Crime – types, sentencing ( types, purpose routes etc)
- Universal Human Rights
- Advocacy
- Bringing about change in the community
