

## Year 11 Geography PPE 1

You will sit a full Paper 1 (Physical Geography) on **Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> November** and then a combination of Paper 2 and 3 on **Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> November**.

During the week before half term you will be provided with something called a Pre-Release resource booklet. In this part of the exam you will get a range of questions about these resources and then you will be asked to make and justify a geographical decision.

In this example, you will be required to decide ***whether or not a road should be built through the Amazon Rainforest in Peru***. There is no right or wrong answer as long as it is well justified by some evidence in the Pre-Release resource booklet.
